 - a. 203 people signed up to attend; max allowed is 250
 - b. 163K has been raised in sponsorships

 - a. Same plan as last year but kids can go into the main sanctuary
 - b. Tent in lower parking lot for family services
 - c. Tent in staff parking lot for Riverside—Linda Milstein working on who will lead the service
 - d. Tickets will be going out shortly
 - e. Brad and Jeremy organizing ushering with JCW
 - f. Would be great if everyone on the board signed up to usher—put board member on the name tags so congregants know the board members are active
 - g. Security schedule is set up
 - h. Police will have the bomb dogs on site and an overnight guard for the electrical equipment overnight.

6- Lewis Gantwerk—Board Member Spotlight-Went to Israel with his wife in 1965 to do something different and a change from living in Brooklyn. "We became immigrants in Israel . We worked with kids who had neurological problems. In 1967 the war broke out and we stayed even though the US embassy told us to leave. Our Israeli friends said not to worry. "Lew went on a tour of the captured territories with a friend. He borrowed a uniform with medals of a high level officer, so he had to take the medals off. He grew up a Jewish boy in Brooklyn but when he got to Israel, he realized how much more it means to be Jewish and Israeli. The Israelis were so proud to be Israeli. "The Jewish journey of my heart started in my time in Israel."

7- JCW update- Debbie Orel

- I'm cochair with Debbi Gitterman.
- And also partners with Men's Club.
- We decided to do more combined programming this year with sisterhood and brotherhood to PEOPLEHOOD. We hope to get more people involved. We want to spread the web of programming more by interest and get more people involved.
- The first event of this year is a collaborative effort of a "Big Apple Bake Off". An event for everyone to participate in.
- Event is on Sept. 18, 2022. The dishes will be Dairy; veg; and contain apple. Preregistration is required.

 - Gabriel and Samantha—what time is the event? Kids programs should be from 12 noon on, so the kids are already here. Need to change the time for the kids so that they can go right after religious school to keep attendance higher.

- This will be a great welcome back event. We need volunteers.

New Business—

A) Alexandra – Thanks to Tom Will for getting the \$150K NSGP grant for security. 10K for PA system; and \$140K for safeguarding the perimeter of the TJC campus with the concrete barricades (bollards) around campus.

B) Great Debates LectureSeries

- a. Our TJC was torn apart on Israel and we need to heal the rift in our community.
- We had restrictions on Israeli programming because of the infighting. But Israel
 is our homeland and in a world of rising antisemitism Israel is plan B for a lot of
 us.
- c. We need to address Israel
- d. Rabbi Merow and Alexandra are focusing work on Shalom Bayit and bringing Israel back to TJC.
- e. The new committee is called "Israel and US", instead of "Israeli affairs".
- f. We have reintroduced new Israel programming, like song of the month; Yom Ha'atzmaut.
- g. We have brough Israel back in a cultural way but we want to bring back Israel in other ways.
- h. Rabbi Merow, Alexandra, and Moshe brough in Professor Waxman to help put together the Great Debates of Jewish History Lecturer series. We will hear the lectures and have peaceful discourse after the lecture with trained facilitators for group discussions.

- i. Participants will be required to attend at least 2 lectures before being allowed to attend the 5th lecture.
- j. Opened only to our community and we hope everyone will attend in person.
- k. The program will be announced soon—if you hear anything negative about this we need to know so we can address the issues. We want to change our negative reputation.
- I. This is NOT a lifelong learning event. They have their own events. This is a Presidential-Rabbi event, so it is funded differently than a committee event. So we need board approval and this is new business. We will vote on this next month.
- Moshe Margolin—funding for great debates
 - 19K in the adult education fund and this will contribute in part to pay for the Great Debates Series
 - We are going to solicit more contributions to help support the program.
 - You need to vote to give up to the budget of \$7500 from the Adult Ed. Fund to Great Debates Series.

Questions and discussion?

- Corey Langer- Why not have virtual component?
- Alexandra—we want the discussion to be in person. We prefer in person, but if we have to have a virtual component we will figure it out.
- Rabbi Merow—we want to have good in person attendance and give Zoom as an excuse to stay home.
- When we are paying speakers to come in person we should have good attendance.
- Barbara—maybe we can arrange drivers for older people who don't want to drive at night.
- We have a membership committee that will offer rides.
- Polly Strauss- this is a great program and love what we are trying to do. I think the words are important and I don't' think the word "Debates" is good. I think we should take out any negative words, such as "debates" and "argument".
- Rabbi Merow the reason we have these words is important because the first lectures are about history from the top scholars. The purpose of the series is to show how people worked things out when they really couldn't get along throughout history. We cant t ignore the fact that there is a debate and there is an argument.
- Susan Falcon- Rational of requiring one or two attendance at lectures and then to attend the last lecture? The reason is because we are attending a lecture and then participating in a discussion and learning how to politely debate. We feel it's important that the process is modeled in the first 4 lectures before they show up for the last lecture.
- Moshe—the 2 questions that will be discussed in the group will be given to us ahead o time by the scholar so people will be prepared and the facilitators can do their job.
- They are starting to give us bibliographies and articles so we will maemake k up a source book so people will take this seriously.

- Alexandra-- Send us any questions before the next meeting so we can vote on the
 restricted funds next month. And if you know any donors, please tell us. We believe this
 is very directed to education that our entire congregation needs, so it's a logical use of
 the restricted funds of adult education.

- Rabbi Merow --We will have an Israel trip this summer it's the 75th anniversary.
- Share what you want to do as a board member:
 - Moshe- Widen our audience to bring in younger adults; we have 2 younger members joining the adult ed committee and we will program during Hebrew school so young parents can attend.
 - Barbara Abramson co-charis of religious affairs an initiative we have this year to
 offer more training to get people to become davenenrs, andshamishim, so that our
 services can run smoothly. Ethan has an online system to sign up but people odnt'
 always feel comfortable, so we want to help them feel more confident. If y ou want
 to learn reach out to Barbara Abramson or Nancy Lewis.
 - Cory Langer—Thanks everyone—this is my first board meeting after 36 years; I'm chair of the safety committee. I was hoping Covid would be in the rear view but we have to contend with this. I want people to join the safety committee and we have to get to the nitty gritty of what is safe during services and we have to get our rituals back in a safe way.
 - o Rabbi Merow—please come to classes to learn with me before the HH. Three classes. There are many classes in October and November. Please come to classes
 - Jerry Neuman—membership- We want to accomplish
 - -ten new members since June
 - -twelve exploratory members last year and 8 out of 12 joined. Great statistic.
 - -Two have declined but still 2 to be heard from
